On behalf of the National Railroad Passenger Corporation (Amtrak), I am writing to express our support for the Kansas Department of Transportation application submitted under the Federal Railroad Administration's (FRA) Corridor Identification and Development Program (Corridor ID Program) for the Heartland Flyer Extension Corridor.

The proposed Corridor is an extension of the Heartland Flyer from its current end point at Oklahoma City, OK on to Newton, KS with stops at new stations in Edmond, OK, Guthrie, OK, Perry, OK, Ponca City, OK, Arkansas City, KS and Wichita, KS. The Heartland Flyer Extension would re-connect Oklahoma and Kansas communities north to the national Amtrak network via the Southwest Chief, allowing residents and travelers to access tremendous mobility available through the major east-west route. Additionally, it will provide public benefits, will make regional travel more available, accessible, and sustainable, will reduce congestion, and will boost the local economy of the cities and towns along the route.
